# Achieving my purpose...

- On June 4th, at the age of 18, I won my first election. I beat two incumbents to become the top-vote getter and receive the Republican nomination for the Mills County Board of Supervisors. I received 884 votes, the 12 year-incumbent received 773 votes, and the 8 year-incumbent received 702 votes.
- I still have a fight ahead of me to become a member of the Mills County Board of Supervisors. The election is now a 5 person race for 2 seats.
- If I lose in the General Election, I will not give up. Although it will be a set-back, I know my purpose is to serve my community and bring beneficial change for its residents. Whether I serve now or in 20 years, I know what my purpose is.
